A story revealed by Sophie Calle's discovery of an unanswered letter





"In Picasso's personal archives at the museum, I found a letter [...] requesting from him an original drawing [...] in order to build La Maison des Yeux Clos with the proceeds from the sale. Just as Sophie Calle is commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the death of Pablo Picasso in her own way – with an unprecedented exhibition at Musée Picasso –, Drouot Estimations will propose a unique ceramic by the Spanish artist in a single-lot auction. The sale, which will be open online until January 27, 2024, is being held on behalf of two associations, Le Livre de l'Aveugle and Fundación Almine Y Bernard Ruiz Picasso.

The auction of this piece is a generous reply by Sophie Calle and Bernard Ruiz Picasso to a letter that went long unanswered. It was sent to the painter on August 25, 1958, and Sophie Calle found it in the museum archives as she was preparing for her exhibition.

Her show at the Musée Picasso is called À toi de faire, ma mignonne, and through it, Sophie Calle examines the work of the Málaga-born artist – as well as her own trajectory – in an off-beat, autobiographical way. Through the four floors of the exhibition, the visitor discovers two galleries that showcase the content of Sophie Calle's live-in workshop in the spirit of a Drouot auction. To complete the display of this imaginary succession, a catalog was compiled by Drouot Estimations. It is coupled with an Erratum in which the artist replaces the auctioneers' descriptions with personal stories about each lot in the collection.

"If I want to banish my fear that, upon my death, their shared history and the history that I shared with them will be erased, I must begin with the general of my estate. I therefore asked the auctioneers of Hôtel Drouot to stage my nightmare: to assess the objects at my Malakoff home and draw up an inventory of my belongings in descriptive but not estimative terms. After all, we live under the same roof, I will not be my own heir, and I am not planning on selling them. They are therefore priceless." Sophie Calle
